

Jim Buttery

Jim Buttery is the inaugural Professor of Child Health Informatics at the University of Melbourne. He is the Chief Clinical Research Information Officer and an infectious diseases physician at the Royal Children's Hospital, Melbourne. He is also the Head of Epidemiology and Signal Detection of SAEFVIC, the Victorian Immunisation Safety Service, and Group Head, Health informatics at the Murdoch Children's Research Institute. Jim trained in paediatric infectious diseases in Australia and Oxford, UK. He has been involved in clinical vaccine trials for the last 25 years. He has been involved in vaccine safety surveillance since 2007, when he founded SAEFVIC, which is responsible for vaccine safety surveillance and clinical services for Victoria, Australia. He is a member of the Global Vaccine Data Network Executive Board, the Strategic Priority Group of the WHO Global Vaccine Safety Initiative, and the Advisory Committee on Vaccines of the Therapeutic Goods Administration of Australia. He is a meta-DSMB member for the CEPI funded SPEAC project supporting the assessment of vaccine safety in CEPI funded clinical trials.
