Your information is important to us.

We are researchers from the Woolf Fisher Research Centre at the University of Auckland. We are doing a research project with your school called ***Developing in Digital Worlds.***

Your school has agreed to take part in this project. We would like to invite you to take part in this research. It starts in May 2018 and ends in December 2018.

This sheet explains what you will be invited to do if you decide to take part.



Your school and the Woolf Fisher Research Centre want to find out about the skills you use when you are learning with others on tablets and Netbooks.

What will you be invited to do?

Both you and your parents/caregivers must agree that you can take part.

If both of you agree, please do these activities with your teacher in class in Term 3 and 4, 2018:

- Two surveys in Term 4, 2018 which take about 30 minutes each. The questions ask you about what it's like to use a tablet or Netbook and will ask you to do some thinking problems.
- Use Google Groups to write a board post with your tablet or Netbook. This will take about 20-30 minutes.



Do you have to take part?

No, you do not have to take part. **If you take part, you** can stop at any time without having to give any reason.

You can ask us to remove any of your information and your signed Assent Form, up to 18 December 2018.



What is your school doing?

Your school has agreed to let teachers, students, and parents/caregivers know that we would like to work with you all to do this research project:

- Your teacher will give you information to take home for your parents/caregivers asking them and you to take part.
- If your parents/caregivers agree to take part, they will need to sign a Consent Form.
- If you also agree to take part, you will need to sign the Assent Form with this sheet (that's because you are under 16 years old).
- Please put these two signed forms in the envelope provided and give it to your teacher.
- Your teacher has agreed to allow researchers to visit your class to watch how they teach you as you use your tablet or Netbook during a lesson. This will happen in Term 3, 2018.
