Background

The Māori and Indigenous Business programme (MAIBUS) delivers advanced education in Māori and Indigenous Business underpinned by kaupapa Māori philosophy.

Study commitment

The programme is delivered online with students studying part time and completing one course in each quarter of each year. It's designed to fit around full-time employment. Students will need to find about 15 hours a week for 40 weeks a year if they are to do well. Depending on prior experience and qualifications students take between 2 and 4 years to complete their Masters. They can join the programme in April each year.

Approaches to learning

Students learn together in small groups and engage in online discussions as well as working by themselves to read, write, watch, and listen to their lectures.

Students need your support

Each course will give students new skills and knowledge that they can use immediately in the workplace and the community.

Graduates will have:

- An advanced knowledge and skills in business processes, strategies and policies that relate to Māori and Indigenous businesses, organisations and communities.
- The ability to demonstrate a critical understanding of cultural values and ethical business practice.
- The ability to conduct independent research, seek innovative solutions and develop business strategies.
- Advanced skills in oral, written and other communication media.
- The capacity to use culturally appropriate methods models and technologies.
