We are happy to announce that our two-year executive programme, the Postgraduate Diploma in Business in Māori Development, is extending its reach from 2021 to make it more accessible to our communities. The programme will be available in three regions – Te Tai Tokerau, Tāmaki Makaurau and Te Tai Rāwhiti. It will also be extended to prospective students who are able to attend a quarterly wānanga in one of these regions. Whichever wānanga you plan to attend, you should apply to the Tāmaki Makaurau (City) campus.

How is the programme taught?

Lectures and course work will be delivered at the quarterly wānanga, followed by online tutorials, zoom meetings, and one-on-one sessions with your lecturer. Every student will receive online learning support and pastoral care.

Who is this programme for?

The PGDipBus Māori Development is designed to build on the knowledge and skills of Māori leaders, executives, entrepreneurs, business managers and administrators who are engaged in Māori business development.

It also attracts other New Zealanders who wish to learn how to work more effectively with Māori and within the Māori economy.

The PGDipBus Māori Development is part of the Te Tohu Huanga Māori Business development programme and can lead to higher study.

Can I apply?

To be eligible to apply you will:

- Have completed a bachelors degree and at least two years of relevant employment experience OR
- Have an approved professional qualification and at least two years of relevant employment experience OR
- Have at least five years of relevant employment experience

Kia hia te wā ka tukuna e au?

How much time should I commit?

You will complete eight courses, part-time, over two years. Courses are taught over quarters, with one course per quarter. In each quarter, classes run for 10 weeks, plus one assessment week and one break week (12 weeks per quarter).

During each quarter, you will be actively studying in wānanga and online for a total of 30 hours. For each hour in the classroom, you should commit approximately three hours to personal and group study.
