An **adverbial phrase** is a group of words which work like an adverb to tell us more about a verb. Adverbial phrases do not contain a verb. They often start with a preposition such as **out, along, up, down, after, in, through, beside, inside** or **on**.

Example: The game was played on the school oval.

(The adverbial phrase on the school oval describes the verb played. It tells where the game was played.)
