Hi again and welcome to the teaching year. This month is all about setting up healthy habits both for yourself as the teacher, but also for the students in your classroom. Thinking about ways that you're doing this is really important and making sure that you're setting yourself up, and your students positively every day is really important. The way you set yourself up and organize yourself will have a flow on effect to your students as they can see you exhibiting what it means to be set up and organized within your classroom. To ensure that you well plan and prepared for your lesson and you know what's coming up this week, and that you're organized when the students present first thing in the morning or session. This demonstrates to them the importance of planning and working outside of the lesson, but it also assistant that ensuring that they can come in and they can be settled and engage in hands on learning when they enter your classroom, you're less likely to say behaviours this way, as students will be engaged the second they step in. Think about setting up expectations in your lessons. You may have a one liner that you remind them of what they're expected to be doing in the session and when they present themselves within your classroom.

Younger students will need a little more reminding of this, but it's also nice of a reminder to remember that as older students will have that opportunity to develop those skills and give them some ownership of that within the lesson and get them to remind you of what they're doing. Don't just present the material and expect them to engage with them. Make sure that you're putting out there and what they're actually meant to do, like demonstrating to them or showing them what the session

might look like, what the outcomes might be at the end. This is more likely to keep students on task as they know what's expected of them during lesson, and it will help them to engage within the lesson and continue to work well on the outcomes that they're meant to be seeing.
