In 2009, Adrian received the Australian Award for Excellence in ICT Teaching and was recently named the 2010 Outstanding Secondary Teacher in the Victorian Education Excellence Awards.

Tony Richards has been a Primary School Educator and IT Advisor and Manager within the Northern Territory and in Victoria. He worked with the Australian Children's Television Foundation on the development of Kahootz as well as managing large scale technology infrastructure projects. Today Tony runs his own business, itmadesimple.com - providing products, services and professional learning activities to schools on podcasting, web 2.0, cyber safety, game based learning just to name a few. He is also one half of the podcasting team 'Ed Tech Crew', exploring ICT in education with a large and growing global audience willing to share their experiences.

Cecilie Murray is Director of Delphian eLearning, specialising in learning innovation and App-titude Learning, which develops educational apps. She is an Australian leader in the use of online learning, particularly in strategic implementation of emerging technologies. She is well known for her work in mobile learning research, strategic planning, online teaching and digital content development. She was senior manager of eLearning at the Department of Education & Training, Victoria, and for the Department of Education, Tasmania. Cecilie is a contributor to a book due to be launched in August 2010, *Mobile Technologies and Handheld Devices for Ubiquitous Learning: Research and Pedagogy* (ed Wan Ng).
