Bites and Stings	All	2	2	Low	Students to be taught how to pick up rubbish (kick or poke areas with a stick). Students to be advised to make noise and only pick up visible rubbish.	First aid will be given if required.
Trips and Slips	All	2	2	Low	Students will be briefed on "no-go" zones and to be careful on treacherous terrain.	First aid given if required. If further medical attention is needed call EMS & follow EAP, page 13.
Sand fly / mosquito bites	All	1	4	Low	All students will wear longs (top and bottom) with closed toed footwear. Small smudge fires if necessary.	First aid given if required.
Deteriorating weather	All	1	3	Low	Staff will stay updated on weather conditions and turn back if weather deteriorates. Rain Shelter can be erected if needed.	Stay on island if weather is too bad to leave. *Lightning – lightning procedures to be followed.

Picking up hazardous waste	All	3	2	Moderate	All students will wear gloves as well as be briefed on what could be potentially hazardous.	First aid given if required. If further medical attention is needed call EMS & follow EAP, page 13.
Stepping on glass or other sharp items	All	3	2	Moderate	All students will wear closed-toed footwear. Students to be made aware of where they are stepping, to avoid stepping on wood and rubbish piles.	First aid given if required. If further medical attention is needed call EMS & follow EAP, page 13.
Sunburn	All	2	3	Moderate	Applied sunscreen, students to wear hats. Activity to be run during non peak heat hours and shady areas for resting to be determined.	First aid will be given if required.
Dehydration	All	3	2	Moderate	All students will carry full water bottles and be reminded to drink water by staff. Extra water supply will be brought on the boat. Electrolytes available.	First aid given if required (Rehydration salts). If further medical attention is needed call EMS & follow EAP, page 13.
