<ul style="list-style-type: none"> checked that his/her timetable team has 'roomed' co-enrolments in a suitable area of the school where each student is able to connect to Aurora's virtual learning environment on a Department computer, connected to the network via Ethernet cable. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> checked that his/her timetable team has 'roomed' science practical periods for each Stage in a laboratory. 	6 December 2019	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> received from his/her timetable team a copy of the integrated timetable of each co-enrolled student, showing clearly when each student is attending Aurora College lessons and lessons at their home school. 	6 December 2019
